Safety Department

SAFETY PERFORMANCE METRICS

During the month of April, PEC offered ongoing CPR classes and a Defensive Driving class to Co-op employees.

The Safety Department monitors trends and responds to potential safety hazards in the workplace. The two industry standards utilized to measure safety performance include the DART and TCIR:

Use of the TCIR to report workplace injuries allow comparison of accident and injury statistics across industries, among industry segments, and from one year to the next. The DART rate is based only on those injuries and illnesses severe enough to warrant "Days Away, Restrictions and Transfers".

*As a general rule of thumb, you want to have a lower DART rate than the TCIR rate.

TCIR = The Total Case Incident Rate calculated as:

Total number of recordable injuries/illnesses x 200,000 / man-hours worked

DART = Days Away Restricted Time calculated as:

Total number of injuries/illnesses that result in Lost Time or Restricted Duty x 200,000 / man-hours worked

Total Man-hours worked YTD (01/01/2017 – 04/30/2017): 413,529.75

Total Man-hours worked in April: 107,275.75

April Incidents

Lost Time:

- None

Restricted Duty Injury:

- Employee injured thumb when trying to move a piece of furniture in their office sustaining a laceration and broken bone
- Employee hit finger while hammering an anchor bolt into a concrete wall, resulting in a broken bone in tip of finger.
- While removing trash from job site, employee caught foot on top of silt fence, fell and hit the ball of left hand on the concrete.

Recordable Injury:

- Employee fractured small toe when outrigger was deployed and lowered onto his foot.

Non-Recordable First Aid:

- None

Vehicle:

- Employee came around a curve and struck a 3rd party vehicle.
- PEC was struck by a 3rd party vehicle when the driver crossed into PEC vehicle's lane of traffic. No injury was sustained by the employee.
- A 3rd party vehicle slid through curve and struck PEC vehicle. No injury was sustained by employee.
- PEC vehicle was rear-ended by a 3rd party vehicle.
- A PEC vehicle was hit by a deer; minor damage to the vehicle, no injury was sustained by the employee.
