



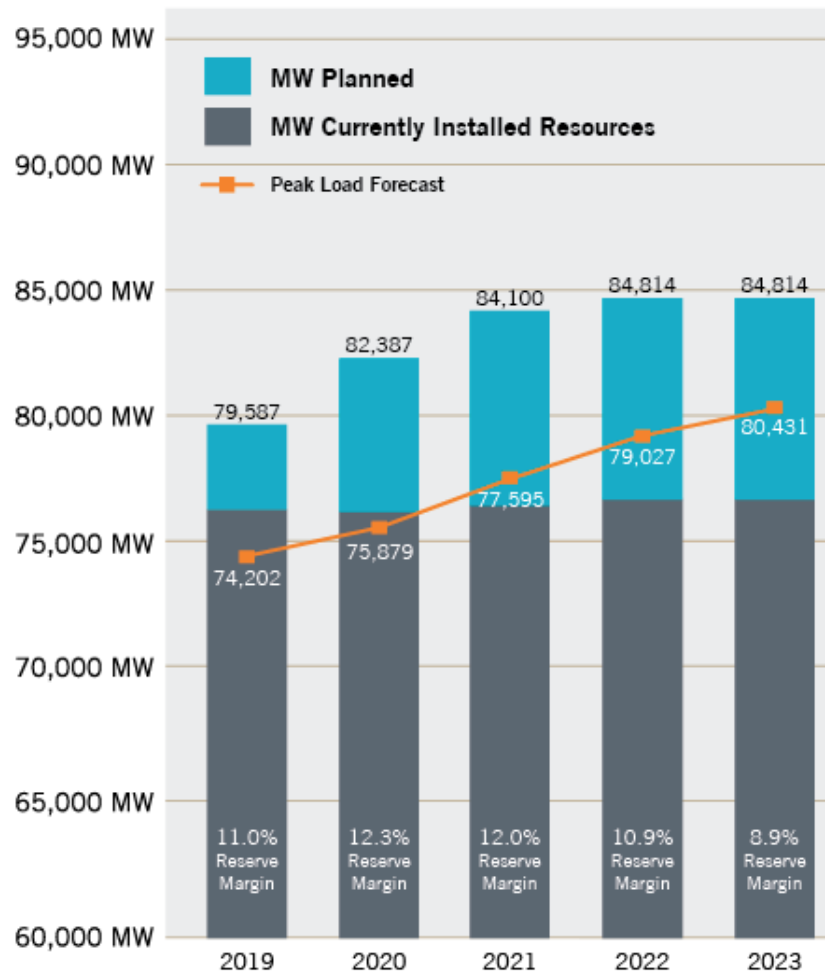

Market update – ERCOT energy supply & demand



- April 30 - ERCOT released final summer Seasonal Assessment of Resource Adequacy (SARA) and the May Capacity, Demand and Reserves (CDR) report
- 72,756 MW - projected summer peak (1,600 MWs higher than last peak on August 2016)
- 78,184 MW - estimated summer generation (up 525 MWs from March preliminary SARA)
- Adequate generation to cover required reserves this summer with typical outages, but below requirement under extreme conditions
- CDR shows reserves through 2022 ranging 10.9% - 12.3%

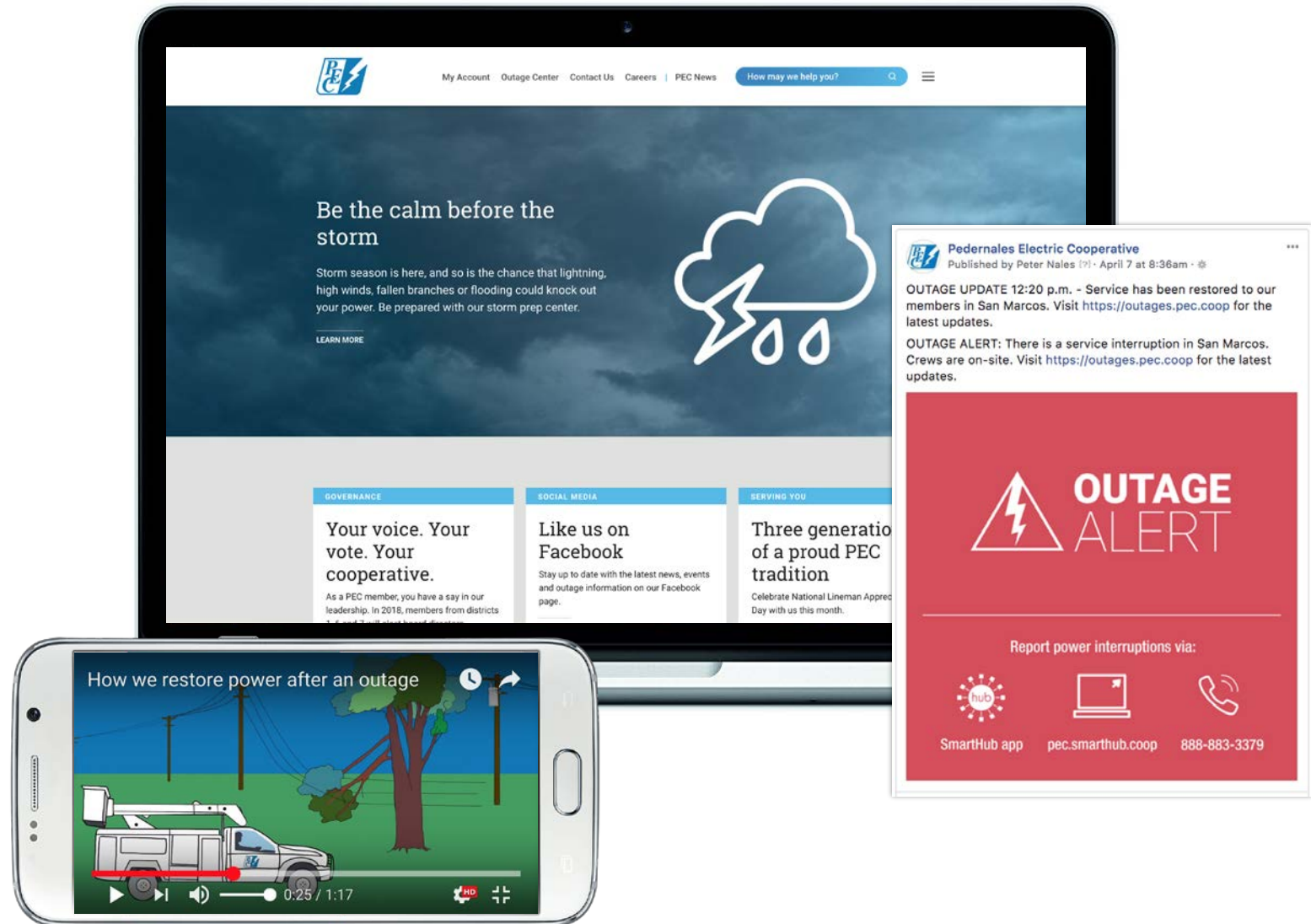

- Developed animated video to educate on how we restore power outages

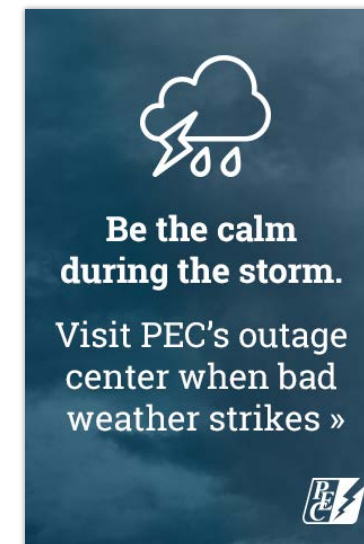
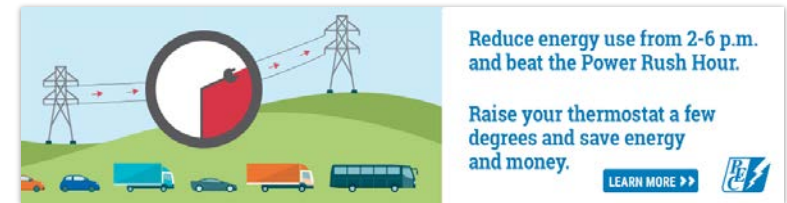


Partnership with KVUE
