


2019 Annual Meeting Survey Results

- Tools: hand-held electronic PEC devices such as mobile phones and iPads, Wi-Fi, and the Survey Monkey Anywhere app


On a scale from 1 to 5 with 5 being the best, what is your overall impression of PEC?








2019 Annual Meeting Survey Questions & Responses

What one thing do you think we could do better?







