- Legacy ERCOT board officially dissolved. October 12, 2021 meeting held with two new independent directors appointed:

- The Board adopted bylaws changing the qualifications for independent board members


## PUC Update

## Public Utility Commission of Texas (PUC)

- Docket No. 52373 - Market Design
- PUC proposing market design change to reduce wholesale pricing cap from $\$ 9,000$ to $\$ 4,500$; change expected early November
- Continuing work sessions on other restructuring issues
- Docket No. 52322 - Securitization
- Commissioners approved unopposed settlement regarding procedural plan for securitization; expecting Final Order soon
- Opt-outs due 30 days from signed Final Order

WATER HEATER AND WATER LINES Insulate external water lines on your water heater

heating water. Remove and store garden hoses, and cover exposed water lines and spigots.

ON'T
Don't use your stove or oven for heat. monoxides and ovens produce carbon when not used as designed. when not used as designed.
Don't run your car in the gara
of warming up. Only run the car outside. and before you start it, make sure that the exhaust pipe is clear of snow and and your family from carbon monoxide poisoning.
Never run a generator closer than 20 feet
from doors and windows to prevent fumes from entering the home.


## EMERGENCY KIT

Be prepared for emergencies before they happen.
Put together an emergency kit with:

$\qquad$ If your pipes do freeze, turn off the main water supply to prevent further damage.

- Pick the lowest temperature you're comfortable with and set your thermostat there - 68 degrees or lower is recommended. When you're not home, keep your thermostat set at 60 degrees.
- Keep drapes and blinds closed, except when windows are in direct sunlight.
- Monitor PEC communications for potential energy conservation alerts and follow guidance when you are able. We'll provide updates when possible on our website and social media channels.
